Background

Before studying law, Birinder Kang worked at the Racial Attacks Monitoring Project, a campaigning organisation which gave advice and assistance to those experiencing racial and police harassment. Her commitment to highlighting the injustices faced by Britain's black communities was further explored during her postgraduate studies, her MPhil thesis focused on 'Black women's experiences of the criminal justice system'.

Birinder has continued her work in anti-racism through voluntary and campaigning activities with the Newham Monitoring Project and the Southall Monitoring Group. She has also worked extensively in the area of domestic violence through the Newham Asian Women's Project and Imkaan.
